

2011 EPSLA Nominations for
US Lacrosse Awards

There have three ends of season awards that are sponsored by US Lacrosse.

They are:

Coach of the Year – This award honors those coaches who exemplify the ideals of the game within the EPSLA. The award is intended to recognize the individuals overall coaching performance and contribution, not just coaching wins – although they may be considered.

Criteria and Eligibility:

- 1-This award is only available to Head Coaches.
- 2-The winner must be a member of US lacrosse.
- 3-Nominees must demonstrate outstanding sportsmanship on and off the field,
- 4-Nominees must demonstrate excellent rapport with officials, other coaches and his own players.
- 5-Nominees did the most with what he had.

Assistant Coach of the Year - This award honors those coaches who exemplify the ideals of the game within the EPSLA. The award is intended to recognize the individuals overall coaching performance and contribution, not just coaching wins – although they may be considered.

Criteria are the same as above except they must be an assistant coach.

Man of the Year – The Man of the Year award honors those individuals whose dedication, commitment and support of the game and its ideals extend beyond his specific team. This is not a coaching award! The award is for the person who has done something truly significant to promote, develop or aid lacrosse at the secondary level in your area.

National Man of the Year-We are eligible for National Man of the Year which is awarded each year at the National Convention. If you believe the EPSLA has a worthy candidate, feel free to nominate them. We will then ask the Executive Board for their opinion.

Nominating procedure:
